




We complement quality of construction with a comprehensive and luxurious level of equipment, which often include lead crystal glasses and Wedgwood[®] fine bone china.

Individually selected oak veneers are used throughout our furniture and are complemented by solid oak details and edgings. These are combined with a craftsman's delicate touch to create furniture with individual expression.

op quality build is one of our main objectives. Our time proven craftsmen ensure that each Carlight is made to the very highest of standards.

For your added peace of mind, we also provide a spare wheel (neatly stored away under the caravan) and a jack. And for safety all caravans are equipped with high level brake lights and a fire extinguisher as standard.

We pride ourselves on our attention to details: The gas bottles can be easily stowed with our slide-out gas locker tray, all the keys are matched on the caravan including the spare wheel carrier, water inlet etc. and high security locks are used throughout for added protection.

Our unique water management system provides probably the neatest and yet simplest solution to fresh and waste water management available. This enables the caravan to be operated from either the mains fresh water supply or alternatively from the on-board watertank via the wheeled fresh water container. The fresh and waste water containers store conveniently in the rear boot together with the waste hoses etc. which keeps the main interior of the caravan clean and tidy.





Dovetailed timber drawers, morticed and tenoned joints, and locker doors cut from a single piece of veneer so the grain of the oak runs through, are hallmarks of skills seldom seen today. However, for over 60 years now, we have been crafting caravans in this manner.





Creating a Classic...

ith each Carlight Caravan we produce we create a caravan with an individual character that matures into a timeless Classic, our older models such as the Continentals, Caribbeans, Cosmopolitans etc. still turn heads today, just as our new caravans do now and will continue to do in the years to come.

Many Companies today retain few of the quality attributes that existed 20, 30 or 40 years ago, here at Carlight all of our traditional trade marks of quality have been retained and blended with modern materials and techniques. Change has never been made for the sake of change and if new methods are not an improvement the old are retained.

For instance we continue to use a traditionally built floor, with timber joists running the length of the caravan and a 12mm plywood floor above, we then insulate the main floor areas with a massive 50mm of Styrofoam (a better insulator than polystyrene but understandably more expensive). This gives one of the thickest and longest lasting floors available. The entire underneath of the floor is then undersealed and this is fixed to our own fully galvanised chassis.





Craftsmanship


Every piece of our furniture is made on the premises and built as good furniture should be with a frame (mostly morticed and tenoned) which is then finished with a real oak veneer. All of our beadings and edgings are machined in the factory and all are cut from solid oak, we do not use any heat applied or similar edgings. Our glazed doors are made of solid oak with a morticed and tenoned frame and carefully mitred inner glazing beads (often machine made doors have rounded inner corners or radiused mouldings on the door panels).






Lockers and Joints

ur locker doors and surrounds are cut from a single sheet of oak veneer so that the grain of the wood runs through the furniture, this is more time consuming to build as it calls for great accuracy, a slip of even 1/4" would ruin a piece of furniture, but this method of construction greatly enhances the appearance of the furniture.



Carlight Locker Detail


The grain of the real Oak veneer runs through the lockers The hinges line up with the beading




The solid brass hinges on our smaller doors (our larger doors are fitted with full length solid brass piano hinges) are fitted so that they line up with the beading around the doors, a small but important detail. We also maintain tradition with our "Gordons" cut out in one of the lockers for safe storage of a Gordons Gin bottle a favourite tipple of the founders (Bob Earls) wife Anne.

All of our timber drawers have traditional lapped dovetailed joints and the beadings on our drawer fronts are rebated into the drawers (rather than planted on top). This makes them more resilient to knocks and gives a neater, cleaner appearance than "planted on" edges.






he underside of the drawers also have additional reinforcing (drawer slips) to ensure the base remains firmly in position. We use a lot of oak building our caravans, as it is both strong and attractive, hence its use for the furniture where its aesthetic qualities can be enjoyed to the full, we also hide it away where its strength is needed, for instance oak is used behind the rear grab handles and between the floor and the chassis to spread the weight of the caravan on to the chassis.


We also rely on other timbers; Deal is strong and not too heavy (we use very good quality timber with very few knots) and this is used for the floors and the sides. Obeche and Jelutong, strong and very light are used for the furniture frame work, (we don't use MDF, chipboard, hardboard etc. anywhere in our caravans).

When we make the sides the joints are halved then glued and then the internal ply lining is fixed on. To clad the sides we use the thickest aluminium used for caravan panelling (no other caravan manufacturer uses aluminium as thick as ours). This traditional method of construction provides a strong, long



lasting caravan, which in the unfortunate event of an accident can easily be repaired.

As you can see we pride ourselves on our attention to detail. For instance, all of the exterior beadings are secured by stainless steel screws, we even fit stainless steel screws to the road lights, awning light & marker light lenses.



Lantern Roof

Use attention to detail continues inside where we use a cloth based ceiling vinyl (most manufacturers use paper based materials) this is glued on after the roof is built, so that no nail holes or ply joints are visible, this material also provides an extremely hard wearing and washable covering.

As well as attention to detail Carlight has earned itself a reputation for sensible innovation when it patented the current flared lantern roof shape and other Companies such as Safari licensed the use of it. The original lantern roof, then covered with canvas, has evolved into the current one piece fibreglass moulding, this, whilst being an expensive shape to manufacture, gives tremendous


Carlight Lantern Roof

advantages in terms of ventilation, streamlining and weatherproofing.


This same spirit of innovation continues today. With our unique waste and fresh water container storage area in the "boot," the neat and convenient fresh water management system which is cleverly hidden away behind a drop down access panel and our simple but extremely

effective folding shower screen arrangement, which gives the convenience of a separate shower, but with no wasted space, (as shown below) which means all our models have a large amount of storage space for their size when compared with other caravans with separate shower facilities.



e were also the first caravan manufacturers to provide a high level brake light, once again putting safety first, and all of our caravans have a spare wheel and carrier and a fire extinguisher as standard.

But caravanning isn't just about safety, its also about enjoyment. Some of our innovations are incorporated to help you enjoy your caravanning more, for instance our wheel arch spat (as shown left) provides a neat solution to the old problem of how to close off the gap in the wheel arch when the awning skirt is in place, and the spat when not required stores neatly in the boot.




After Sales & Parts

e provide a friendly and convenient aftersales service. We recommend that all new caravans are returned to the factory for a 500 mile service, where we check the brake adjustment, the torque settings on the axle and coupling bolts etc. and make any minor adjustments as required to the interior catches, handles etc.

We also recommend our caravans are serviced every 3,000 miles or annually, (whichever occurs first) to ensure that the caravan provides pride and pleasure of ownership and remains a valuable asset.

Such regular servicing will ensure the longevity of your new caravan and to

compliment this, we have a spares policy that provides a 90% parts coverage for all of our caravans upto 10 years old and ensures consumables i.e. brake shoes, wheel bearings, oil seals etc. and accident repair panels are available for caravans upto 20 years old.

What is a Factory Warranted Caravan?

hat is a Factory Warranted Caravan? Take a selected Carlight caravan, subject it to rigorous checks, refurbish and service it using original materials and craftsmanship

and in the same factory as the new Carlight caravans are built, and then offer it for sale with a factory backed warranty.

It sounds easy, but as the following sequence

of photographs show, it certainly isn't, and we go to great lengths to ensure the finished product is just a little bit special, just as you would expect from Carlight.



 Before starting work a job sheet is completed listing all of the work that is to be carried out.



Typical of the minor problems we come across are things like broken window catches and ...



 Damaged rub rail end caps. But more serious problems of panel damage means all the aluminium panels of this caravan are to be replaced and the fibreglass panels sprayed.



4. Here the awning rails are removed.



As are the doors, windows etc



Allowing the panels to be removed.



New panels are cut using the original patterns to ensure a perfect fit.



 Then the waist rails and window rails are refitted. Note how the mastic is protected from dust and dirt by a protective strip, which is only removed immediately prior to fitting.



The window rubbers are then replaced and bonded to the caravan sides.









....So what do you get for what is still a large investment for most people? Well, lets start off by saying that most people don't buy a Carlight with the object of trading it in after a couple or even five years.

The Caravan Clubs "Tried & Tested Caravans" articles ask users to fill in a detailed questionnaire about their caravans, this gives the opinions of those that matter; the owners. We feel therefore, this article is very important because it gives the opinion of owners who have used their caravans, often for quite extensive periods.

The Carlight 152 is the caravanning equivalent of a suite at the Dorchester. It has, as one owner put it, an "air of excellence," and is a "pleasure to sit and admire."it's not just quality of build and finish that makes these models so valued. Owners are asked to mark some 80 features of their caravans as either

The interior of the Carlight is stunning, and quite unlike that of any other caravan. The top quality oak woodwork and finishing is exquisite. All cupboards are flush fitting and cut from one panel so the grain of the oak flows through. The handles and latches feel extremely durable

Carlights washroom has fold-out shower doors that completely enclose the shower area - infinitely better than a shower curtain. Bedtime is a straightforward affair in the Carlight. There is no messing about with slats or cushions to make a double bed. The entire nearside seat slides across, while the offside seat also pulls out to give maximum width. The backrests fold back against the wall too, so they don't get in the way....

....we preferred it, not least because the single front window admits lots of welcoming light, and there are no curtains or pillars to obscure the view....'

The quality is exceptional, it oozes luxury and we appreciated its beautiful finish everytime we opened a cupboard door. ....how about a beautifully built, as good as new Carlight for around \$10,000 to £15,000 - and possibly for as little as £7000?

Here's how it works. When an owner trades in a much-loved Carlight for a new version, the factory takes in his used model and gives it a thorough overhaul, before offering it for sale in tip-top condition at a more affordable price. Robert Hodgson, managing director of Carlight, says his company has been turning out a 'factory-warranted' van every one or two weeks for the past 11 years. 'We have a checklist that we work through on each of these caravans. We are not trying to change their character, but to get it so a customer can buy one and know ... They are buying a van that's been

'We do an awful lot of work and some of it is under the skin, he added.... If you look after it and get it serviced once a year it will go on as long as you want it to.'John and Ann Rudkin, from Grantham, Lincolnshire are Caravan magazine readers who own one of these factory-warranted models. Theirs is a 1991 Carlight Commander 152EK, which they bought for £11,500 just over a year ago. Its price new was £21,975. I visited

thoroughly overhauled from top to

them at the Caravan Club's popular site at Chatsworth Park located in the Peak District.

In the 1940s and '50s John went to school near the Carlight factory in Sleaford, Lincs, and thinks this is why its name kept popping into his head when he was deciding on a change of caravan. 'I thought I couldn't afford it,' he said. 'They do not advertise much and you don't see many on pitches, but I rang Robert Hodgson and he told me to come and look at their secondhand vans. This one was available and we decided to take it. If we don't have an accident with our caravan and look after it, it will be as good in ten years time as it is now. To paraphrase a saying 'Old Carlights don't die, they just go on and on'.... we have always liked things of quality. We've always bought the best we could afford. Personally, there is no doubt in my mind that Carlight are the best. Once you are hooked into them, I don't think you would have anything else. You are paying for quality and if it happens to be at £11,500 and not \$22,000, does it matter?

John and Ann's Commander has the sort of specification you'd expect from a luxury caravan, including hot water, toilet, fridge a heater with blown-air, four-burner hob, grill, oven, blinds, a TV point, plus 12v and mains electricity.

Working on Caravan magazine has given me an anorak ability to tell whether a model was manufactured in the early, mid or late 1990s, but with this Carlight two-berth I really couldn't tell. 'It's 1991 cum 1999,' said John, 'I defy anyone to tell me which is which.

Inside and out, their caravan was immaculate. The interior was light and airy, the fastenings and hinges were strong and secure, the veneer on the light wood was real, not plastic, and the drawers featured dovetailed joints. There were some great details, too, including a fitted step, a double wardrobe with pull-out wire trays, an adjustable support behind the back rests in the lounge, three sets of double sockets, and even a bread bin!

John, who's 58, has just retired, so he is looking forward to some happy touring years ahead. 'Carlight has brought out a 162 with a rear locker and I might look at a used one of those when one becomes available, maybe in five years' time.'
All refurbished Carlights come with a one-year warranty, and they seem to hold their value well....

So how will you choose to spend your money - a brand-new caravan or a used but reconditioned Carlight?

The choice, as they say, is yours....



Commanding Presence. Practical Caravan Magazine April 2000

When Carlight invites us to view a new model, there's a lot of oohing-and -aahing in the office as we prepare to be amazed once again by this top independent maker. And, once again, it did not let us down, this time with its new Commander 162 EW.

You won't find fibreboard cupboards here, nor locker flaps. Instead, each cupboard door fits into its locker wall so perfectly that you couldn't even get a knife blade between the gap. Pull out a drawer and you will see beautifully tailored, dovetail joints. And again, not a scrap of fibreboard or plastic in sight, merely handcrafted, lightweight beechwood.

All the 162 EW's hinges, stays and catches seem a nautical mile ahead of those from mainstream makers - boat suppliers provide Carlight with all these attachments, so they're stronger, more solid and far more attractive to look at. The whole ambience of the front dinette is

more like a cabin cruiser than a caravan. Indeed, even the oven and hob are supplied by SMEV, another marine manufacturer. And adding to the quality of the kitchen is a green baize-lined cutlery drawer and china....

What surprises most about this new Carlight is not its staggering luxury but the surprising degree of practically that complements it. Outside the van, the insulated gas locker reveals enough space for two 6kg bottles or a single 13kg unit. In addition, the base on which they sit pulls out, providing superb access. This principle is applied to the battery box, too. The battery slides out on rail for total access. Next to this is a locker, offering combined access to all gas taps, the water filter and fresh water ports.

Practical Genius

Best of all, though, is the Fiamma winterised waste system. A wide-bore expandable tube has twist-fit connectors between tank and van, so it's completely enclosed....

Inside the van, the oven cover doubles as a tray. In the lovely end washroom, there is a pullout stool so you can sit in front of the mirror and dresser. Near the door is a compartment with a flip-top bin and above the door another contains a fire extinguisher and rechargeable torch.

Most impressive, though, is the double bed layout. The entire nearside bunk slides into the centre of the floor to join the offside bunk so there's no hand-to-hand combat with mattresses - sublimely simple. Even as single beds, both bunks pull out six inches or so from the wall, so you don't have to find somewhere for the backrest cushions.

Exclusive, exquisite and practical. Fancy a Commander? You won't get much change from £27,000 but then you are paying for the best.

The Lap of Luxury. Practical Caravan Magazine May 2000

Beauty, practicality and all the trimmings - what more could Andy McPhee have wished for as he spent his time testing out this top tourer? It could almost be seen as decadence....

....the Carlight looked really at home and its glass-like exterior finish really shone. There's certainly no mistaking this visually distinct luxury tourer.

Practically Beautiful

Beauty is not just skin deep, though. There's a kind of practical beauty in most of the Carlight's external services which is not to be found in any other caravan I've stayed in.

Let me explain what I mean. To begin with, pitching was a doddle. Once unhitched, the van's Carver Motor Mover made an effortless job of positioning the tourer, and although it's a \$1000 option, if I could afford to spend \$27,000 on a caravan I don't think I'd be worried about the extra cost.

The best facility, though, was the Fiamma waste water system. A huge, expandable tube twist-fits onto both waste tank and caravan, so that all the waste collects into the one tube. All is contained, and there are neither leaks nor smells.... Both the waste and fresh water tanks can be stored inside the spacious boot at the rear.

The water filter, fresh water ports and gas taps are housed in a separate locker next to the battery box. It's ideal, because everything is together and pitching time is kept to the minimum. Everything is to hand and it's a pity that other makers haven't incorporated this idea. Likewise with the battery box: if anything goes wrong, the battery simply slides out on rails allowing unhindered access. The gas box features a similar mechanism for gaining easy access to the bottles.

Living Area

From the moment you set foot inside the

Commander you know that you are in a luxury tourer. But it's not so opulent that you fell overwhelmed.... The woodwork is light and lends a coachbuilt airy ambience to this tourer but the feature which enriches it most lemon-coloured upholstery and satiny-red cushions. Mind you, it wouldn't matter if this colour scheme didn't appeal to a potential buyer because.... customers are able to choose their own soft furnishings. How about day-day living in a luxury tourer? It's an eminently practical van. For instance you need never faff about with cushions again: if you choose to sleep in two single bunks, all you do is pull the bunk out six inches from the wall and it's ready for use - easy: need to make it a double? Just pull the nearside bunk out until it meets the offside bunk and.... well, that's it. There's your double bed. No back-breaking gymnastics needed in this tourer.

Carlight really seems to have thought of everything, even down to the set of bed -end light switches so you don't have to get out of bed to switch the lights on and off. By day, too, the front dinette was just as easy to use. There are two, light, clip-on tables to use. I used the short one for cuppas, simple snacks and light lunches. The full-length table was perfect for full mealtimes.

Up above, the mains control unit is the best I have seen in a tourer. Everything is contained in this one unit. Usually, switches such as hot water isolator, heater isolator, 12v master switch and the like are, for some reason best known to the maker, spread all over the caravan and require a map and compass to locate. Not so with the Commander everything is to hand. The only separate switch - and I do mean only - is the water heater selector which is tucked neatly beside the nearside

Cooking Up.

Cooking and preparing meals was easy in the big Carlight, as one thing it's not short of is worksurface. The drainer, sink and cooker are all enclosed by wooden flaps, so you have the entire length of the kitchen at your disposal for food preparation. Even if you are using all your kitchen, the expansive side-board behind you will cope with the extras. Believe me, space is not a problem in the Commander. Then, when you're getting rid of all your choppings and waste, you'll find the built-in bin next to the door an added bonus. And it's just like a domestic bin. hidden in its own cupboard next to the main door.

Ablution Solution

The end washroom in the Carlight offers a number of solutions to traditional problems. For instance, next to the comparatively low rear window: Carlight has installed a pull-out seat so you can sit at the adjacent dresser mirror in comfort. Also, you can separate the toilet, shower and deep, stainless steel wash basin from the rest of the washroom, allowing the natural light to flow through from the rear window and enabling a clear view to the rear of the caravan. An added bonus of this set-up is easy access to the large wardrobes. And, these have a Fanmaster exit which means that your jackets can be warm as toast before you go outside. The whole arrangement is convenient in every way. The water pressure is great, too: just like domestic pressure....


Verdict
